

# Calculators in Exams



<p><b>Calculators must be:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Of a size suitable for use on the exam desk;</li> <li>• Either battery or solar powered;</li> <li>• Free of lids, cases or covers.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Calculators must not:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be designed or adapted to offer any of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Language translators;</li> <li>• Symbolic algebra manipulation;</li> <li>• Communication with other machines or the internet;</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Be borrowed from another candidate during the examination for any reason;</li> <li>• Have retrievable information stored in them. This includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Databanks;</li> <li>• Dictionaries;</li> <li>• Mathematical formulae;</li> <li>• Text.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>You must not bring any operating instructions or prepared programs into the exam room with your calculator.</b></p>
<p><b>You are responsible for:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The calculator's power supply;</li> <li>• The calculator's working condition;</li> <li>• Clearing anything stored in the calculator;</li> <li>• Removing parts such as cases, lids or covers.</li> </ul>
